# North Kirklees & Morley Circuit June 2024

### From Joanne Gibson, Circuit Steward:

As a family we always sit and watch tv for an hour together. We are avidly watching 'Race Across the World' Series 4 - in fact, as you read this, it will be the final episode this week! The aim is for the teams to reach a destination by any route they like however there are no flights, compasses or phones allowed – only a map. They are given the same amount of money that the flight would cost to get them to their final destination. This year they begin in Japan and must reach Indonesia. The teams may cross several countries on their journey - it is a test of endurance and of relationships (I want the best friends to win!). Do they take the scenic route seeing some amazing sights? Or do they take the quickest route and keep ahead of the race, focusing on what is at the end? There are lots of different ways to get to where they need to be. Many of us are working in teams in our churches and Circuit. I know that some are on difficult

journeys with decisions to make and that right now some are finding it hard to see the end goal. We wonder if we will ever get there and the work is hard. We need to keep praying and work together, sharing resources and ideas, supporting each other. Several of our churches are looking at the Eco Church awards ...some tips from A Rocha

Eco Tip - Cut your carbon in the garden centre: Who doesn't love a trip to the garden centre? Especially if it involves cake! Here are some reminders from Sarah Leedham, our Foxearth Meadows Reserve Manager, that will help you make better choices for the planet when you're buying plants:

- Use peat-free compost.
- Read the label. Was it grown in the British Isles or imported? Imported plants carry a greater risk of introducing pests and diseases.
- What is the pot made of? Is it plastic or something biodegradable?
- How long will it last? Is it worth buying annuals or could you fill your garden with perennials which last longer?
- Is it good for insects? Choose plants with simple flowers ones without lots of petals. They are more likely to attract bees and butterflies.
