From Rev. Nick Cutts:

I write this as September ends and the month of October opens and I am sure that many of us will have noticed how quickly the nights are drawing in. We may have thought that we were going to have a late summer, although you have probably noticed that this has not really materialised. I am writing this on a dark, wet September evening which can dampen the spirit - but for the people of God there is a surety that God is within all places, all situations and all times. Over the last month I have asked congregations and groups where have you noticed God over the last few days?

This is a question for us all, for so often we can become blinkered and therefore blinded to where God is present and working. A couple of weeks ago I was asked what had been a highlight of the previous few days? It had been a particularly difficult week and there did not seem much within it to celebrate and give thanks for. But as I started to reflect, there were so many times, as I thought through the week, that were positive and in those moments I saw God. These moments could be found in various forms, from a conversation to a helping hand, but it was finding God in the ordinary and the normal.

Is it that we expect God moments to be extraordinary, momentous occasions for this is God we are speaking of? But as John Whittier writes in his hymn, God speaks through the earthquake, wind and fire, O still small voice of calm! There is so much noise around us of different varieties and things vying for our attention which cause us to be dragged along, that we can miss those moments where God is. It was only as I reflected on a 'difficult week' that I noticed God, not in the noise but within the quietness. Each moment we receive is extraordinary and momentous because it is a gift which is precious. As Paul spoke to the Athenians as told in Acts may we search for God and perhaps grope for him and find him-though indeed he is not far from each one of us. So please notice, for God is present. Give testimony, telling each other, and in that we can all be encouraged and see God in our midst.
