There are two types of shop I find difficult to pass – the ones selling cakes and those selling books.

So it was unrestricted joy when, on a recent visit to Horncastle in Lincolnshire, we found one of each in very close proximity.

Having sampled the sweet delights in the first, we headed for a delightful bookshop called Jabberwock, a Tardis-like establishment which proved much bigger on the inside than it appeared on the outside.

As Linda and I navigated the labyrinth of corridors and rooms packed with books on every known subject, I came across an excellent religious books section where I discovered a real gem – The Penguin Book of Christmas Carols.

I love carols with a passion and so the book now sits by my bedside as I wind up to Christmas. And it gives a detailed history of carol singing itself as well as providing a potted history of 100 carols.

It's hard to imagine that Oliver Cromwell once banned carol singing and that "Hark the Herald Angels Sing" originally started out as "Hark, How All the Welkin Rings". Charles Wesley's original was fine-tuned by others, much to the disapproval of brother John, but it's the amended version which we still love so much today.

The book also highlights the fact that James Montgomery, who wrote "Angels From The Realms of Glory", actually lived in Mirfield for a while, although by all accounts he wasn't very happy while he was here. But there's no accounting for taste.

The Penguin Book of Carols is a veritable treasury and it will no doubt come out every Christmas now and it is a timely reminder of how so many composers and writers have sought to glorify the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Some are sentimental, some remind us of childhood, some raise our spirits with their soaring melodies. Some paint a picture of the baby arriving amidst the winter snow. Some challenge us with their words: "O

hush the noise, ye men of strife, and hear the angels sing".

Silent Night is my favourite, largely because I can still hear my father singing it in fluent German in the bath on the nights before Christmas, He was taught it by a German guard while he was a prisoner of war for nearly four years. Something good out of something grim...

You will all have your own favourites and your own memories. Whatever they are, they point us to the light shining in the darkness, the boy in the manger who came to save us all. As one Mirfield resident once wrote:

"Angels from the realms of glory,
wing your flight o'er all the earth:
Ye who sang creation's story,
now proclaim Messiah's birth.
Come and worship, worship Christ the new-born king."

Tidings of comfort and joy to you all this Christmas.
